



SESSION 4:

RICH BUDGET WISELY: ALIGNING YOUR PURPOSE

"Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine." — Proverbs 3:9-10

Budgeting is more than just managing money—it's an act of faith. When we create a budget, we acknowledge that everything we have belongs to God, and we are simply stewards of His blessings. A well-planned budget reflects our trust in Him by prioritizing our needs, giving generously, and avoiding unnecessary financial stress.
